## A few thoughts from Greg Bleach, Skillway General Manager.

25 years young! Skillway has been serving local young people for many of those years at our beautiful chapel building in Godalming. A sanctuary for many where they can be themselves and enjoy learning manual skills and a positive work ethic. How many have we worked with over that time? There must be many hundreds of adults out in the world now having experienced some time in the Skillway workshops.

This was brought home to me recently when I attended a function at Guildford Cathedral. Our Skillway display was out and a family came along to look at the creative projects on our stand. The father slowly had the realization that this was part of his story as well. This man in his mid-thirties went onto explain to his family and myself how he had attended Skillway in 2003/4 (when I first started), that he had been 'a right pain' at school and how Skillway had taught him some real life skills and given him the confidence to move on from school and us when it was time.

Since that time he had become a professional tradesperson, together with his wife bought up a family and still lived locally. His daughter even added how her dad had made her a hutch for her pet rabbit and how good it was.

So there you have it in a nutshell! Being just one small link in a chain that enables young people onto a positive path. Sometimes it's not easy and we have to occasionally admit that we cannot meet the needs of a particular young person, but many more leave us having had an inclusive personal experience, that remains with them and has made a difference.

So, to the people who had the original idea, all those founder trustees and volunteers, the many volunteers since, my wonderful long serving staff, I thank you. Simple in idea maybe, but fraught with hurdles along the way, it is amazing what we have all achieved.
