Message from the Chair

At the last Churches Together Executive meeting, we had a discussion about Council, which according to our constitution is the governing body of CTIGD. What's the purpose of these general meetings, apart from carrying out necessary legal requirements such as approving accounts? It's an extension of the question of the purpose of ecumenical organisations like Churches Together as a whole. We know that structural unity between any of our denominations is a long way away, but also that Christians of different denominations are not strangers to one another as once they might have been.

When times are challenging for all our churches, the natural tendency is for us to concentrate limited resources of time and effort on the church community we belong to. But that's also precisely when it can be helpful to meet together and exchange experiences, and that's what I would like Council to do. Now that CTIGD's AGM is in March, we are moving the next Council meeting slightly later in the year to Monday 17 July (venue to be confirmed) and I hope we can hear about our experiences of initiatives that have tried to alleviate the recent cost-of-living stresses and the challenges they have faced. Each member church has official representatives on Council (not that I think any church actually sends a full complement!) but anyone can come so I do recommend taking part to you.
