Message from the Chair

Hopefully Churches Together will be able to host a Godalming hustings events with our local general election candidates towards the end of this month, as we have on previous occasions. It will depend how many of the candidates are able to make it!

Like any other group of voters, Christians hold a variety of different political views and don't form a separate body of opinion with the same outlook. I expect all of our Christian communities pray for our elected representatives because we recognise the hard (and arguably in some ways impossible) task they have to perform, balancing different considerations and practicalities to determine public policy. But in a secular society we don't expect that they will necessarily represent us rather than any other social group. Although the Church of England still has a privileged place within the constitution, it exercises it with a very light touch, and in reality – as opposed to symbolism – Britain's public life is a long way from any direct connection with Christian thinking, in so far as it ever was.

That doesn't mean that God is unconcerned with our public life, with the common decisions we take together about how our society should be run – about the way it distributes its resources and the priorities it sets. As Christian voters we have a responsibility to consider deeply how what we believe is reflected in the organisation, law, and moral life of our society. We all have only one vote to cast, for one individual, and that means that vote will almost certainly represent a compromise between perhaps conflicting hopes and priorities: but it should be a compromise with prayer behind it.
