Message from the Chair

It hardly needs saying how peculiarly turbulent and uncertain the world seems at this moment, with things we have relied on and taken for granted being questioned and turned upside-down. Leaving aside whatever one might think of the current governments of the United States and Russia, their enthusiastic endorsement by some evangelical churches in the one case and the Russian Orthodox patriarchate in the other feels very uncomfortable.

We have a strange situation in the UK, or at least England does, with the Establishment of the Church of England and Anglican bishops sitting in the House of Lords (as is often pointed out, you have to go to Iran for a parallel to that). Yet the CofE has long since abandoned any attempt to repress its rival Churches and its relationship with the Government isn't always smooth. Nobody expects a close alliance between the state and believers.

Secular authority has its proper sphere of action, St Paul maintains, and some political environments will be easier for Christians to live in than others; some may end up positively hostile. But looking to the secular power to achieve God's purposes is a terrible temptation for Christians: the Kingdom is always somewhere else, and every attempt to bring it about by political action comes to grief.

In this country, through long struggle and not inconsiderable suffering, we have come to a place where religion is not a branch of government. That's beneficial for society at large, and certainly for religion itself.
